

2010 ECCD ANNUAL SPRING SEEDLING AND PLANT SALE

WHAT: Bare root seedlings and potted plants, all winter hardy to at least Zone 6, which is our growing area (descriptions and order form follow).

WHEN: **Order deadline:** March 20, 2010 postmark.

Southern area pickup at the **Norwichtown Mall, 42 West Town Street, Norwich, 06360** (space donated by Edens & Avant): 1:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. on Friday, April 16th; 9:00 a.m. to noon on Saturday, April 17th.

Northern area pickup at **Brooklyn Fairgrounds, Route 169, Brooklyn** (space donated by the Windham County Agricultural Society): 1:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. on Friday, April 23rd, 9:00 a.m. to noon on Saturday, April 24th.

Please indicate on the order form whether you will pick up at the Southern or Northern area. This is important since the seedlings and plants for each pickup point are delivered a week apart and are not carried over from one pickup to the other.

HOW: One hundred seedlings of most tree species can fit easily into a grocery sack. Potted plants take up more room. Be prepared to keep the roots of the bare-root plants moist and covered until actual planting. Herbs and perennials should be sheltered until mid-May.

AND: The District cannot be responsible for any orders not picked up by noon on Saturday unless prior arrangements have been made. Sorry, there are no refunds on orders not picked up.

Code Key for plants:

**BD – attracts birds, BE – attracts bees, BT – attracts butterflies,
HM – attracts hummingbirds, N – native, RG – works well in rain gardens**

BARE ROOT EVERGREEN SEEDLINGS

1. FRASER FIR: 7 to 14 inch tall 4-year bare root seedlings. Shiny dark green foliage with a silvery underside and superb needle retention, prefers fertile, well-drained soil. Excellent Christmas tree and ornamental.

2. BALSAM FIR: 6 to 12 inch tall 3-year bare root seedlings. Needles are 1 inch, excellent fragrance and retention, grows best in cool, moist sheltered locations. Widely used for Christmas trees and ornamentals.

3. COLORADO BLUE SPRUCE: 8 to 16 inch tall 3-year bare root seedlings. Color ranges from blue-green to silvery blue, superb color, excellent shape, good growth rate. One of the finest for Christmas tree, ornamental and windbreak use. **BD**

4. NORWAY SPRUCE: 10 to 20 inch tall 3-year bare root seedlings. Fastest growing spruce, short-needed with deep green color. Demand for Christmas tree, ornamental and reforestation. **BD**

5. WHITE SPRUCE: 8 to 15 inch tall 3-year bare root seedlings. Very hardy, compact, with short blue-green needles, fast rate of growth, tolerates wide variety of soils. Used for Christmas, ornamentals and windbreaks. **BD**

6. WHITE PINE: 8 to 15 inch tall 3-year bare root seedlings. Soft blue-green needles 3-5 inches long, fast growth, excellent needle retention. Desirable for Christmas, ornamentals, reforestation. **N,BD**

7. AUSTRIAN PINE: 10 to 20 inch tall 3-year bare root seedlings. Beautiful dark green, long needles, extremely hardy, tolerates poor soils, dry soils and air pollution. Christmas, ornamental and windbreak tree. **BD**

SHRUBS & BUSHES (#2 or #3 “gallon” containers)

8. WINTERBERRY, *Ilex verticillata*: Dense form, deep green foliage, bright red berries, excellent landscape border, provides cover & food for native birds. Easy to grow, tolerates sunny, partially sunny, moist or wet spots. Matures to 8-10' tall. (#3) **N,BD,RG**

- 9. ELDERBERRY**, *Sambucus canadensis* ‘Adams’: Dense, round, deep-green foliage, profuse creamy white flattened heads of flowers, followed by abundant dark blue/black berries, provides cover and food for birds & butterflies. Matures to 8-10’ tall. (#3) **N,BD,BE,BT,RG**
- 10. FLOWERING DOGWOOD**, *Cornus florida* ‘Cloud 9’: Dense, thick, slower growing, extreme bud hardiness, covered in blooms late April-early May. Prefers semi-shade of wooded border. In late summer-fall provides red berry-like fruit eaten by over 100 species of birds! Matures 18-20’ tall. (#3) **N,BD**
- 11. PUSSY WILLOW**, *Salix discolor*: Provides flower catkins in spring, often used for cuttings, provides varying food sources for bees, birds, and butterflies, and cover for birds. Tolerates most soils, including moist. Matures to 20-25’ tall. (#2) **N,BD,BE,BT,RG**
- 12. BUTTONBUSH**, *Cephalanthus occidentalis*: Upright, green foliage, teeny white flowers group to form 1” diameter balls, creating a unique ornamental look. Bees & butterflies love the flowers, seeds are excellent food source for birds. Enjoys sun or partial shade. Matures to 5-10’ tall. (#2) **N,BE,BD,BT,RG**
- 13. MOUNTAIN LAUREL**, *Kalmia latifolia* ‘Pink Charm’: Rounded, dense, shiny, deep green foliage, superb strong-pink flower in late May-early June. Likes shaded, wooded locations, tolerates shallower drier soils. Provides nectar for bees, cover for woodland birds. Matures to 8-10’ tall. (#2) **N,BD,BE,RG**
- 14. HYDRANGEA**, *Hydrangea arborescens* ‘Invincibelle Spirit’: Ultra hardy, dense form, dark pink 6” blooms maturing to bright pink mid-June to frost. Likes sun or partial shade. Matures 4-5’ tall. (#2) **N**
- 15. LOW BUSH HONEYSUCKLE**, *Diervilla lonicera* ‘Copper’: Dense, spreading, deep green foliage, small yellow flowers late spring-early summer. Provides food for birds from fall-winter. Extremely pest free. Likes sun or partial shade and does well in dry areas. Matures 2-3’ tall. (#2) **N,BD,BE,BT**
- 16. JUNIPER**, *Juniperus communis* ‘Blueberry Delight’: Rich, deep green, needle-like foliage with silvery-blue hues on upper side, deep bluish-purple cones resembling berries through fall-winter, attracting birds. Tolerates hot sun, droughty soils, even some shade, good cover for rough soil areas and critters. Matures 15-18” tall. (#2) **N,BD**
- 17. SPICEBUSH**, *Lindera benzoin*: Oval, upright, with tiny yellow-green flowers, followed by pungent foliage providing nectar to bees and butterflies. Deep green leaves provide bird cover, red berries provide food to birds. Grows well in most locations, tolerates shady and moist. Matures 6-10’ tall. (#1) **N,BD,BE,BT,RG**
- 18. DWARF HUCKLEBERRY**, *Gaylussacia dumosa*: Slowly spreads by rhizomes, can be used as ground cover, dark green, semi-evergreen foliage, develops small white-pink flowers in June, shiny, tart black edible berries for birds and humans. Likes partial sun, moist to wet, sandy soil. Matures to 8-24” tall. (#1) **N,BD,RG**
- 19. RHODODENDRON**, *Rhododendron maximum* ‘Independence’: Big rounded form, strap-like leaves, massive globes of clear pink flowers bloom late June. Likes shade, wooded. Matures to 8-12’ tall. (#2) **BT,RG**
- 20. HOLLY**, ‘Blue Princess’ *Ilex x meserveae*: Dark blue-green foliage and exceptional berry production, full sun or partial shade. Matures to 12’ tall. (#2) **BD**
- 21. HOLLY**, ‘Blue Prince’ *Ilex x meserveae*: Male is needed to pollinate female for berries, dark blue-green foliage on purple stems, extremely hardy. Matures to 8-10’ tall. (#2) **BD**
- 22. AZALEA**, *Azalea* ‘Hino Crimson’: Hardy, compact, spreading, deep green foliage. Blooms early to mid-May with brilliant medium-sized crimson flowers that cover the plant. Matures to 3-4’ tall. (#2)
- 23. LILAC**, *Syringa x hyacinthiflora* ‘Pocahontas’: Vigorous growing, rich green foliage, upright multi-stem form, flowers early May with fragrant, violet flower panicles. Matures to 12-15’ tall. (#2)
- 24. CLIMBING ROSE**, ‘America’: Time tested, blooms throughout growing season with masses of coral-pink flowers, divine, spicy aroma that fills the air. Does well in summer heat. Matures 10-12’ tall. (#2)

WOODLAND & MEADOW PERENNIALS (#.5 “gallon” containers)

25. **MAINDENHAIR FERN**, *Adiantum pedatum*: Delicate shape, stalks fork almost in half, covered in delicate segments about .5” long. Likes shade-part sun, moist soil. Matures to 12-30” tall. (#.5) **N,RG**
26. **VARIEGATED JACOB’S LADDER**, *Polemonium reptans* ‘Stairway to Heaven’: Low mound of med-green leaves edged in creamy white and splashed with pink. Lightly fragrant violet-blue bells rise tall in mid-late spring. Good shady border. Likes moist soil. Matures to 10-16” tall. (#.5) **N,BE,BT,RG**
27. **WILD GERANIUM**, *Geranium maculatum*: Soft lavender flowers in spring, distinctive, deeply-cut leaves. Shade-part sun, moist woodland spot. Can spread by seed. Matures to 1-2’ tall. (#.5) **N,BT,RG**
28. **WILD BLEEDING HEART**, *Dicentras eximia*: Robust medium green foliage, long blooming pink flowers June-late summer. Likes shade-part sun, moist soil. Matures to 12-18” tall. (#.5) **N,BT,HM,RG**
29. **BLUE CREEPING PHLOX**, *Phlox stolonifera* ‘Blue Ridge’: Large, soft blue flowers over low compact tufts of leaves. Attractive ground cover. Sun-part sun, moist soil. Matures to 6-10” tall. (#.5) **N,BT,RG**

PERENNIALS (#1 or #2 “gallon” containers)

30. **BEE BALM**, *Monarda didyma* ‘Jacob Cline’: Deep green fragrant foliage, deep scarlet 3” tubular flowers blooming July-Sept. Likes sun to partial sun and good airflow. Matures to 3-4’ tall. (#2) **N,BE,BT,HM,RG**
31. **CONEFLOWER**, *Echinacea purpurea* ‘Ruby Star’: Upright growth, big, fragrant, carmine red daisies bloom late July-early Sept. Full sun, dry to moist soil. Matures to 36-42” tall. (#2) **N,BD,BE,BT,RG**
32. **BROWN EYED SUSAN/THREE LOBED CONEFLOWER**, *Rudbeckia triloba* : Yellow, deep brown centered daisies blooming June-Sept. Full sun, tolerates drought. Matures 36-42” tall. (#2) **N,BD,BE,BT,RG**
33. **BLUE FLAG IRIS**, *Iris versicolor*: Sword-like foliage, blue-violet flowers with white markings bloom in early summer. Loves moist, sunny spot. Perfect around water features. Matures to 2-3’ tall. (#2) **N,HM,RG**
34. **CARDINAL FLOWER**, *Lobelia cardinalis*: Dense clump of upright stems, profuse scarlet-red two lipped tubular flowers late July-Sept. Loves moist, swampy areas, or constantly moist soil. Matures to 2-4’ tall. (#2) **N,BD,BE,BT,HM,RG**
35. **BUTTERFLY WEED**, *Asclepias tuberosa*: Umbels of small orange flowers bloom mid-July to August. Provides food for Monarch caterpillars and nectar for Monarchs. Likes drier spot. Matures 18-30” tall. (#1) **N,BD,BE,BT,HM**
36. **CORAL BELLS**, *Heuchera americana* ‘Dale’s Strain’: Chartreuse foliage matures to silvery-green, May-June pinkish-red flower stems rise above foliage. Likes well-drained partial shade. Matures to 12-24” tall. (#1) **N,BD,HM,RG**
37. **TICKSEED**, *Coreopsis verticillata* ‘Moonbeam’: Delicate needlelike foliage, with pale yellow daisies blooming July-fall. Likes sunny and well drained soil, and is drought tolerant. Matures to 12-18” tall. (#1) **N,BD,BT,RG**
38. **SHASTA DAISY**, *Leucanthemum x superbum* ‘Snowcap’: Compact dark green foliage, single, pure white daisies with yellow centers, blooming June-August with deadheading, tolerates wind, rain. Matures to 12-15” tall. (#1)
39. **STONECROP**, *Sedum spectabilis* ‘Autumn Joy’: Large, bushy broccoli-like plants with pink flower heads in August that turn deep mauve-red by fall, blooms August-October. Matures to 12-24” tall. (#1) **BD,BT**

ORNAMENTAL GRASSES (#1 or #2 “gallon” containers)

- 40. PENNSYLVANIA SEDGE**, *Carex pennsylvanica*: Glossy green foliage in early spring, forms rounded tufts, seed stalks rise above foliage in late spring with yellowish-brown flowers. Likes dry, dark, shaded landscape. Matures to 6-8” tall. (#1) **N,BD,BT**
- 41. SHENANDOAH SWITCH**, *Panicum virgatum*: Upright, steely blue-green foliage turns burgundy red from late spring-summer, light, airy, small red flowers, Likes sun. Matures to 3-4’ tall. (#1) **N,BD,BT,RG**
- 42. NORTHWIND SWITCH**, *Panicum virgatum*: Tall, easy to grow, narrow, upright, wide-bladed, dark olive-green foliage, summer stalks with showy, upright flower panicles above foliage. Likes poor, sandy, droughty to moist, well-drained soils. Matures to 5-6’ tall. (#2) **N,BD,BT,RG**
- 43. LITTLE BLUESTEM**, *Schizachyrium scoparium* ‘The Blues’: Loads of slender green foliage in clumps, seed stalks in August with purplish-bronze flowers. Likes dry or moist soil. Matures to 2-4’ tall. (#2) **N,BD,BT,RG**

KITCHEN GARDEN

- 44. BLUEBERRIES**: *Vaccinium* high bush: Individually potted plants, 12” minimum size; grow in full sun with moist, acid, well-drained soil. For cross-pollination, we offer sets of three - one each of: early bearing, mid-season and late-season plants, propagated in CT. **BD,BE,BT,RG**
- 45. ROSEMARY**, *Rosmarinus officinalis* ‘Arp’: Upright, bushy, dark green-gray foliage, small purple flowers, loves full sun and good air flow. Does well in containers. Matures to 3-5’ tall. Perennial. (#1)
- 46. GARDEN SAGE**, *Salvia officinalis*: Dense, bushy medium green foliage, long, purplish, flower spikes, great in food & wreaths. Likes full sun. Matures to 24-30” tall. Tender Perennial/Annual. (#1) **BE,BT,HM**
- 47. PARSLEY**, *Petroselinum crispum* ‘Italian’: Fanlike foliage, likes full sun and well drained soil. Does great in garden or container. Matures to 15-24” tall. Biennial. (#1)
- 48. HOT PEPPER**, ‘Cherry Bomb’: Sturdy, vigorous, continually flowers and setting hot peppers that mature 75 days later, thick wall makes them excellent for stuffing or pickling. Matures to 30-36” tall. Annual. (#1)
- 49. RHUBARB**, *Rheum* ‘Cawood Delight’: Vigorous, shiny, scarlet-red leaf stalks, big, deep green, crinkly leaves. Likes full sun & deep, moist, well drained soil. Harvest May-June. Matures to 2-3’ tall. 2-year plant. Perennial. (#2)
- 50. BLACK RASPBERRIES**, *Rubus* ‘Bristol’: vigorous, upright form, produces big, jet black, sweet raspberries. Harvest beginning mid July. Likes sun or partial shade and good drainage. Matures to 4-6’ tall. 2-year plant. Perennial. (#2) **BD,BE,BT**
- 51. STRAWBERRIES**, ‘Cavendish’: Excellent flavor and overall quality, attractive large fruit, winter hardy, long growing season, good resistance to disease. Sold by bundle of 25 bare root plants. Perennial. **BD**

LANDSCAPING NEEDS

- 52. BARLEY STRAW**: Don’t forget to buy your barley straw for controlling algae in your pond. Bales can be ordered on our plant order form! Visit our website at: www.ConserveCT.org/eastern.
- 53. FERTILIZER TABLETS**: 1 application fertilizes 2 full years. Use 1-2 tablets (for #1 - #2 containers) for each plant set out. Easy to use, safe, will not harm new trees or shrubs. After holes are dug, place 1-2 tablets in the hole under each plant, shrub or tree. Tablets slowly release plant food and feed plants to new beauty for 2 full years.
- 54. SOIL ANALYSIS**: Performed by UConn Soil Lab: Standard nutrient analysis with limestone and fertilizer recommendations given. This analysis is recommended for most lawn and garden samples. Sampling is best done in the fall, but can be done anytime. Kit contains instructions, mailing bag and includes analysis and recommendations.


